PAC heads to quinella

Prince Alfred College rowing eight is on target to seal an elusive quinella at West Lakes today by adding a prestigious Head of the River victory to its *The Advertiser* Shield State title.

The last time Princes won the 'Tiser Shield was in 1993 when they went on to take the coveted double and win the Goss Shield as well. Coach John Curtis hopes history will repeat itself.

"I'm looking at it as a good omen. This is also my third year (coaching rowing at PAC) and the first two crews finished second so maybe it's third time lucky," Curtis said. "But it's going to be a very close race, there's no clear-cut favorite this year."

Last year's winner Scotch College, Pulteney Grammar School, Pembroke and St Peters are all strong contenders for the championship.

Five members of PAC's eight — Booth, Ledgard, Cox, Manuell and Jones — rowed First VIII last year when PAC was second to Scotch College.

Walford's eight again will be the centre of attention in the schoolgirls racing as they strive for their sixth successive Florence Eaton Cup.

The crew, which has won the event every year since it has contested the Head of the River, has successfully tested its skills on a national level this month, winning silver at the national championships in Sydney, only 0.02 second behind the winner.

Pembroke and the much-improved Wilderness crew seem the only threats to continuing its winning run.

Racing starts at 10.15am at West Lakes and will conclude with the premier events, the boys's First VIII at 1.55pm and the girls' First VIII at 2.05pm.
